#### TEA-NOISETTE-CHINA COLLECTION AT RUSTON'S ROSES: Commenced 2007. Updated Nov 2013

Budwood can be purchased from Ruston's Roses once the plants are sufficiently established, say 3-4 years after planting (earlier for ramblers).

The Collection, like any garden, is a work-in-progress. Some varieties are incorrect from most sources; we will keep replacing till we get the right ones, if they still exist in Australia. If you have a rose you feel belongs in the Collections, please contact Pat Toolan, David Ruston or Margaret Furness; quarantine restrictions have become much tighter, and may be difficult.

Some of the names and classifications may be revised with time. Some are controversial, and IDs suggested as "possible" should not be taken as definite. Single inverted commas indicate the original name of a rose; names in double inverted commas are study names. Syn = synonym. Many old roses have been assigned names which are incorrect (they don't match the original description of that rose). We refer to these as "Rose sold as ..." or, on the labels, "Not...". We welcome suggested IDs.

Plants donated mainly by David Ruston, the Friends of Bishop's Lodge, Margaret Furness, John Nieuwesteeg and Pat Toolan; cutting / budding material donated by Ruston's Roses and many old-rose lovers. Arthur Christou of Country Rose Nursery, Gawler assisted generously with budding many of the 19th century foundlings, and Brad Taylor at Paringa by growing many varieties from cuttings. The roses were planted by David Ruston and various other HRiAI members.

The Rose Society of Australia, HRiAl, The Chaffey Rose Society and Gregg Lowery of Vintage Gardens, California, were very helpful, in funding the labelling and trellising. Brent Dickerson's "The Master List", Dianne Ackland's "The Australian Rose Directory" and the Australian Tea-Rose Group's "Tea Roses – Old Roses for Warm Gardens" and <a href="https://www.helpmefind.com">www.helpmefind.com</a> were of great assistance in compiling the lists. Patricia Routley did much of the work of documenting parentage and provenance in the first year. We are grateful for the generosity of Anne Ruston, in providing the garden beds and supporting structures, and maintaining the Collections.

The founders of HRiAl collected many of these roses in the 1980s; their names are documented elsewhere. In recent years, vigorous collectors have included the Tealadies and Patricia Routley in WA, the Friends of Bishop's Lodge in the Hay district, Pat Toolan and Elizabeth Newell in SA, Leonie Kearney in Queensland, and the *Goldfields and Beyond* group, Merna Zwar and Geoff Crowhurst in Vic. Barbara May & Jane Zammit have been the main carers for the Rookwood roses.

Plants are on their own roots unless an understock is named. M = mature plant transplanted. 2014 on the left means that we hope to plant the rose in 2014.
